

A SUGGESTION? CENTRAL HERD FOR CO. ANTRIM.

(Run under the auspices of the Society, but owned by a private member who takes all responsibility.)

 The Society shall assist by asking for donations and subscriptions to go opposite the upkeep of the Herd.

Young animals to be sold to members from this Herd from time to time at the discretion of the Society through their Registrar.

3. The owner of the Central Herd to be required to keep a set of books and render an account each year showing the money spent on food, cattle and wages, also the money received for milk and calves.

Profits after expenses are paid to go to the Society.

Lettle from this Herd will be exhibited in the joint names of the Society and the owner.

PREFACES.

You are all interested, I know, in the restoration of the ancient Irish Moiled breed of cattle, for the purpose, if possible, of giving our numerous small hill farmers hardy, useful beasts, which can give paying results in milk and beef on home-grown produce.

The Irish Moiled Cattle Society was formed for this purpose, and the great success which it has achieved in such a short time was quite evident to all observers at the Great Balmoral Show.

The future efforts of our Society should get our most serious consideration, and this is the more necessary owing to the fact that the Ministry of Agriculture is unable to allow us to import pure bred bulls from Finland. In order to get over this difficulty, it will be necessary to collect all our best material at one centre and there to breed up bulls of the correct type and parentage for distribution among our members.

I am of opinion that the cheapest and best way to do this is for our Society to subsidise a member who is an experienced cattle breeder and let him carry out the work with the help and advice of our Registrar.

I have no doubt but your Committee will give the matter their consideration in the near future.

I take this opportunity of thanking you on the position which, in a short time, the Irish Moiled Cattle Society has attained to, and this is almost entirely due to your keenness and ceaseless energy on its behalf. I am a firm believer that there is a place for the Irish moiled cow, which cannot be filled by any other breed; and the progress of your Association shows what an appeal this animal is making to the small farmers.

My advice now, as always, is to stick to the old characteristics of the breed; do not try either to ape the Shorthorn or to contest the position of that great breed. Whilst the Shorthorn is, and I believe will, always remain supreme in his own sphere, there is room for both breeds, and, in fact, need for both.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT.

(CAPTAIN J. GREGG, O.B.L., Hon. Secy.)

A few years ago a number of gentlemen in Ulster formed themselves into a Society for the purpose of grading up what remained of the native Irish Moiled Cattle of the country.

The idea was, and still is, to try and preserve these for the small hill farmers of Ulster; because it has been long known that the native cattle give better results on poor herbage than the more pampered imported breeds. (Immediately after the war Capt. Dixon started a herd of moiled cattle on his Co. Kildare estate, but the Irish rebellion made it impossible for him to carry out his scheme; the captain, therefore, must get the credit for originating the idea.)

The aim of the Society is to retain the hardy qualities of the breed, the original whiteback colouring, medium size, the good milking qualities, as well as cows capable of producing fair store calves. In a word, the Society wants the hardy qualities of the Kerry breed, but with larger size and more beef; a short-legged, squat animal, halfway in size between the Kerry and the Shorthorn.

We are gradually working our way to the ideal. The process will be slow, but we feel that it will be worth while. It would have been quicker if we had been able to import the descendants of the original trish cattle from Finland (but it is just possible we may be able in the near future to get in these Finnish bulls under special licence). At the moment we have 355 animals on the register, belonging to 150 members.

The breed has been very successful in proportion to its numbers in open competition with other breeds in the milk recording contests. In 1926, Mr. John O'Neill's cow, "Bessie," was the heaviest milking cow in Co. Antrim. In 1927, Mr. Jas. McConnell's cow was the heaviest milking cow in Ulster. In 1928, Mr. Jas. T. Barnes' cow, "Kate," was the heaviest milker in Ulster. In 1929, Mr. Barnes' cow again got that distinction. Besides these, moiled cows were frequently adjudicated the best dairy cows in the different milk recording associations over the country.




"Dunturk Tardy."




"Upton Whiteback II."





Do we still Quarrel about our Cattle?

Most of the historic quarrels between the Irish clans were over cattle; for example, Queen Maeve of Connaught went to war with the King of Ulster over a special white bull ("Four Masters").

Our ancient chieftains, in order to better identify the cattle belonging to their clans, in case of raiding or stealing, had cattle of particular colour and type for most of the clans. Some of these were horned, black, white, red or grey—brindled, spotted or white-backed; others had the same gamut of colouring, but moiled.

During the last half of the eleventh century the Danes and other Norsemen stole much cattle from Ireland. About 1068 Magnus Barefoot, King of Scandinavia, cleared most of the cattle from Co. Antrim, largely belonging to the clans O'Neill, McQuillan and O'Cahan ("Four Masters"). These cattle were red or grey and moiled with white strips down their backs.

It is interesting to know that they are the cattle of Sweden and Finland to-day, besides the tradition in the former country is "that they came long, long ago, over the sea from Ireland."


These Irish cattle have been bred pure in Sweden and Finland, and improved by selection rather than by introducing outside blood, which latter has been our custom. The appearance of the cattle is identical with our own Irish moils.

It is said by Swedes and Finns that they are the only breed that will give economic returns on the poor, cold pastures of Northern Sweden and Finland, it is generally now believed that they give better returns in milk and butter on the bare pastures on the mountainous and hilly districts of Ireland than do the imported breeds. In this respect they are like the Kerry cattle, but the Irish moil produces remunerative stores, and on that account are more dual purpose than the Kerry. We think we have at last rediscovered in our own cattle the most remunerative small farmer's cow. This has been proved during the last three years, if milk recording means anything.

The competitions of the Central Milk Recording Society, N.I., goes to show that a Donegal bred moiled cow (Clan O'Donnell strain) was the best dairy cow, 1926. Then 1927-28, another Donegal bred moiled cow and a Sligo bred moiled cow were the best dairy cows in Ulster. This proves, I think, that we have the best "world strains" of milch cattle at home, and that of the native breed; if we could only get the habit of selecting and "boosting" our own rather than importing those "boosted" by outside breed interests?—From "Irish Trade," 10/11/28.


Note.—There is a still more important point in favour of the Irish moil, and that is, that they are not liable of contract tuberculosis.

Finnish Cow.


A pure bred Irish Moiled from Finland; officially tested; averages 1,200 gallons of 4% milk.





ADVICE TO THOSE WHO PROPOSE TO COLLECT CATTLE OF THE IRISH MOILED TYPE.

- 1. Such cattle should be short of leg and large of stomach; that is, low and squat.
- 2. They should be of the dairy type rather than of the beef type.
- 3. They should be roughish in make, not fine or delicate looking, as the latter are not suitable for the rough herbage of the hills.
- 4. They should be red in colour with a white stripe down the back, and moiled.
- 5. Given the right type and colouring in a female beast, it should be purchased, even if horned. The horns can be bred off by the bull.
